The name Petrinja most likely has its roots in the Latinized Greek word *petrus*, which means rock, stone.

## In the heart of Croatia




Petrinja is located in Sisak-Moslavina County, on the edge of the historical Banovina region. The town is located on the slopes of Zrinska and Hrastovačka gora in Donje Pokuplje on the right bank of the Kupa river, where the Petrinjčica river flows into the Kupa.

## Two locations, one town

The first Petrinja settlement was founded about ten kilometres from the present location near the village of Jabukovac, and it was to this settlement that the Slavonian Duke Koloman granted the Charter of a Free Royal City in 1240. In the second half of the 15th century, due to Ottoman incursions and devastation, many fortresses and old cities, including Stara Petrinja, were destroyed and abandoned. At the present location of the town, the continuity of settlement can be traced back to 1592, when the Turkish military leader Hasanpaša Predojević built new Petrinja at the juncture of the Petrinjčica and Kupa rivers. The fortress was the starting point for the devastation of Croatian regions until the final conquest in 1595, after which it remained permanently in Christian hands. Since that time, the Petrinja fortress has been organized as the centre of the Petrinja captaincy, which is under Croatian rule and becomes a key point of defence for the Petrinja-Sisak Pokuplje region. As part of the Military Border, a specific defence system in Europe established to stop the Ottoman conquests, Petrinja becomes the seat of the Second Ban's Regiment in 1753. By the decree of Maria Theresa in 1773, it receives guild privileges as the central place of guild crafts in the Banovina region, and in 1777 it also receives the status of a privileged city of the so-called military community, which it would have until demobilization in 1881. Petrinja is one of the rare European settlements that serve as a unique example of the cessation of the existence of a once active urban structure in its original location and its relocation from the old to a new space.





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The cultural and historical entity of the town of Petrinja was protected in 1962 as a cultural monument.

A settlement gradually develops outside the fortress, and the second half of the 18th century is marked by economic enthusiasm and development, which influences the flourishing of construction activities and the further building of the town. Petrinja, in addition to being a military one, gradually grew into the economic, educational and cultural centre of the Banovina region. In the period around 1780, the most significant urban and architectural interventions are made. Petrinja gains its main urban accent thanks to the arrangement of the square, the construction of military and church buildings, as well as civic houses. During this period, the main streets of the town as we know it today are designed, with recognizable examples of Baroque and Classicist construction, while the 19th century is marked by the construction of Historicist buildings.



Throughout their history, cities have developed and prospered, and so has Petrinja. However, it has also suffered some devastating events. At the end of the 20th century, from 1991 to 1995, Petrinja experienced wartime devastation, occupation of the town, and expulsion from its homes. The Greater Serbian aggression was stopped by the military-police operation Storm, which liberated the occupied territory of the Republic of Croatia. This was followed by the long-awaited return to the beloved city after the liberation of Petrinja, on August 6, 1995. Therefore, that day was proclaimed the Liberation Day of the Town of Petrinja and the Day of the Croatian Defenders of the Town of Petrinja. The restoration and establishment of social and economic development, as well as all components of modern life, gave the people of Petrinja firm faith in overall prosperity. However, Petrinja was hit by a catastrophic earthquake at the end of 2020 and numerous others, of somewhat lesser intensity, during 2021. There was repeated destruction and abandonment of homes, workplaces, institutions, favourite squares and gathering places of inhabitants. Everything seemed unreal and too sad, and residents were once again experiencing the most horrific situations. Now, although many buildings and homes have already been rebuilt, the restoration and revitalization of life is still ongoing, as is the faith in building a new town worthy of a comfortable life.



Petrinja's first earthquakes, which happened on December 28 and December 29, 2020 were of the magnitude of 5.0 and 6.2 on the Richter scale respectively, and the intensity at the epicentre was VIII degrees on the EMS scale.



A park in the town centre originally serves as a military training ground, and later has a role of a square where fairs are held. The park takes on its character at the beginning of the 19th century when Napoleon's army plants Illyrian linden trees during their stay in Petrinja from 1809 to 1813. At the end of the 19th century, it is arranged as a town park, in which a meteorological column gets installed in 1891, and a music pavilion a year later. Along with the linden trees, ornamental plants and rare trees such as the gingko biloba, known as a living fossil, the only organism to have survived the ice age, are planted. Once the city establishes a water supply system, a unique fountain with bronze figures is placed in the centre of the park in 1914. The town park is dominated by the parish church of St. Lawrence, the patron saint of the town of Petrinja. The original, late Baroque sacral building from 1780 was completely demolished during the Homeland War. The church has been rebuilt in its original architectural form, thus preserving the typical view of this park.





## Parish Church of St. Lawrence

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The Christian army first conquered the Petrinja's fortress on August 10, 1594, on the feast of St. Lawrence, which is why this saint was later declared the patron saint of the town of Petrinja. Every year this holiday is celebrated as the Town of Petrinja Day, and the festivities last for ten days under the name *Lovrenčevo in Petrinja*.

The bronze figures of the boy with the turtle were made by the sculptor Ferdo Cus.

The park was declared a monument of park architecture in 1969.

On St. Lawrence's Day in 1996, Archbishop Cardinal Franjo Kuharić placed the charter on the construction of the church of St. Lawrence into the foundation stone retrieved from the altar of the demolished church.

The parish church of St. Lawrence, the patron saint of the town of Petrinja, was built in 1780 on the large, spacious square of what was then a military training ground. The patron of the construction was Empress Maria Theresa. During the recent occupation of Petrinja, the church was completely demolished in 1992, and after returning to Petrinja, it was rebuilt according to a facsimile, with the further design of architects Renato Cottier and Davor Salopek. On St. Lawrence's Day, August 10, 2000 the newly built church was consecrated and blessed by the Archbishop of Zagreb, Monsignor Josip Bozanić.



The Petrinja's Promenade is a circular walking trail 6.6 kilometres long and is a real contribution to a healthy lifestyle. It starts at the Josip Kajetan Knežić Promenade, from the Volunteer Bridge. The trail initially leads upstream along the river, passes by old Petrinja's mansions and football fields, then goes uphill to the oldest Petrinja cemeteries with the chapels of St. Rok and the Holy Trinity, dating from the 18th century. The trail leads through relaxing wooded areas with a beautiful panoramic view of the town. During the walk, you can rest and refresh yourself in the catering facilities while enjoying delicious dishes of Petrinja's traditional cuisine.


The trail is marked with signposts with a direction arrow and a yellow linden heart-shaped leaf mark, which is a recognizable visual symbol of Petrinja as *a Small town with a big heart*.

# The Petrinjčica river



Thanks to its great biodiversity, the course of the Petrinjčica river represents a kind of school in nature, which is visited by numerous pupils and students.

The Petrinjčica River springs up on the slopes of Zrinska Gora at 560 metres above sea level, and after 36 km flows into the Kupa near Petrinja, not far from the town beach. In its upper course, the river passes through wooded areas with the specific landscape of a mountain river. The last two kilometres of the Petrinjčica are calmed by an embankment, a part of the popular Petrinja's Promenade. Its stream is slowed down by cascades and smaller waterfalls, while the embankment is decorated with rows of linden and acacia trees. The Petrinjčica and its basin represent a diverse nature reserve with a number of protected plant and animal species and rich fossil sites from the Mesozoic era. The river is home to about twenty species of fish, of which several are protected.





At the end of the 19th and beginning of the 20th century, at the arranged military town beach near the confluence of the Petrinjčica and Kupa rivers, students from town schools learned the basics of swimming. The first purpose-oriented and arranged river bathing area was opened in 1902, and then constructed as a permanent town beach area in 1921. The current building of the town beach was built in 1942. The Kupa river near Petrinja is a wide and calm river that offers relaxation and refreshment from the summer heat with its clear water and the beauty of its arranged banks. The town beach is rich in various entertainment, recreational and catering facilities during the summer months, of which numerous events with programs for all generations stand out.



As part of the Green Flower campaign in 2013, the Town beach was declared the most beautiful public beach in the area of Sisak-Moslavina County.



## Council of Europe Cultural Routes











Petrinja has established three Council of Europe cultural routes. These are Destination Napoleon, Camino Banovina and the European Ceramics Route. Destination Napoleon was established thanks to the heritage of the Illyrian linden trees on the Strossmayer Promenade, which were planted by Napoleon's army during their stay in Petrinja from 1809 to 1813. Camino



Every year, Petrinja organizes: FLIK -**Pottery and Ceramics** Festival dedicated to the long tradition of the art of production from Petrinja clay, bringing together numerous entrepreneurs and artists, and Camino Banovina - a pilgrimage cultural route dedicated to Saint James and is part of the European pilgrimage route of Santiago de Compostela.

Banovina pilgrimage route was established in 2022 thanks to the chapel of St. James. It is 75 kilometres long and covers the areas of the towns of Sisak, Petrinja, Glina and the municipality of Topusko. Ceramics Cultural Route is dedicated to the three-hundred-year tradition of pottery and ceramics in Petrinja, and its development is also contributed to by the protection of pottery in Petrinja as an intangible cultural asset.

# Fortifications of the Petrinja region

Klinac, Pecki and Čuntić forts were built with funds from the Zagreb diocese by the mid-16th century as part of a defensive system against the Ottomans. Despite their good geostrategic positions, all three forts ceased to be in use by the end of the 16th century. The Čuntić tower, which can be reached from the village of Hrvatski Čuntić, has been restored and is accessible for visitors.

## Public monuments

#### Monument to Stjepan Radić

The Monument to Stjepan Radić is the first public monument to a significant Croatian politician and the first public monument in Croatia made by a woman. In 1929, sculptor Mila Wood made a statue of a supernatural size of 2.5 metres from Petrinja clay, which was cast in plaster and then in bronze. The monument was erected and ceremonially unveiled in 1936 on Stjepan Radić Square. The monument disappeared during the recent occupation of Petrinja, but was



later found and restored and placed on its old location in 1999. The entire renovation of Stjepan Radić Square was completed in 2003 according to the design of architects Renato Cottier and Davor Salopek.

#### Banov kamen (Ban's Stone)

Banov kamen (Ban's Stone) is the first public Petrinja monument erected in 1846 in the village of Župić. It was erected by military officers and soldiers as a sign of gratitude to the then Colonel Josip Jelačić, commander of the 1st Ban's Regiment in Glina. From 1843 to 1846, Jelačić's soldiers repaired and widened the existing road between Gora and Petrinja, for which Jelačić was most responsible. A replica of the monument was erected by the Matica Hrvatska Branch in Petrinja in 2009.

#### **Fountain**

In mid-June 1913, Petrinja received its first public monument in the central town area – Strossmayer's Promenade. The fountain consists of a larger oval basin, on the rim of which are four bronze sculptures of boys with turtles. The bronze figures were made by sculptor Ferdo Ćus. The local population never called turtles turtles, but frogs.

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#### Monument to Colonel Predrag Matanović and his comrades

A memorial dedicated to the fallen defenders of Petrinja was erected in 1997 on Senjak. It was made by academic sculptor Marijan Glavnik from white concrete in the shape of a lightning bolt. The monument was renovated in 2015. It features a relief medallion with a portrait of Colonel Predrag Matanović and the emblem of the Second Guards Brigade, Gromovi. The names of 233 Croatian veterans who died in the Homeland War (1991-1995) are engraved on the plaques next to the monument.

#### The Man and the Bull Monument

The bronze sculpture The Man and the Bull was created by sculptor Lovro Findrik in 1971 to mark the 150th anniversary of the *Gavrilović* factory. During his summer stay in Petrinja, sculptor Findrik created a model of the monument from iron, hemp, and plaster. Cast in bronze, the monument is placed on a nine-metre-high pedestal in front of the *Gavrilović* factory.

#### The Letters Monument

In 1989, a three-meter-high aluminium sculpture The Letters, the work of academic sculptor Ratko Petrić, was placed on the National Teachers' Square. The three-dimensional letters of the sculpture intertwine and build on each other, symbolizing the centuries-old tradition of educating future teachers in Petrinja.

#### Skela spasa (The Lifeboat) Memorial

Skela spasa (The Lifeboat) Memorial in Nebojan stands as a reminder of the first open attack on Petrinja on September 2, 1991, during the Homeland War. The ferry transported a large number of people who were forced to leave their homes, but it also transported defenders who came to the city to resist the aggressor.

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#### Monument to Stjepan Greec and his comrades

A monument was erected in Kotar Šuma in 1996 - a bronze bust of Brigadier Stjepan Grgec, commander of the 57th Brigade of the Croatian Army *Marijan Celjak*, alongside a memorial plaque to ten Croatian veterans who died during the Military Police Operation *Oluja* (Storm).

#### The Memorial in Novi Farkašić

The Memorial in Novi Farkašić is a witness to the victory of the Croatian Army over the aggressor. At the site where one of the decisive battles was fought, a memorial with a tank on a pedestal and an information plaque about the victory of the Croatian defenders in October 1991 has been erected.

#### Memorial Plaque in honour of the French journalist Pierre Blanchet

In 2017 and at the incentive of the Croatian Journalists' Association, the Town of Petrinja erected a Memorial Plaque in honour of the French journalist Pierre Blanchet. The black granite plaque in the shape of an open book was placed in Turkulinova Street, where Blanchet died in 1991 while reporting on the Homeland War.

#### **Dove Monument**

Monuments made of granite slabs with a crack in the shape of a cross and a gap in the shape of a dove symbolize the sacrifice and suffering of Croatian veterans and civilians. This monument by academic sculptor Slavomir Drinković marks all mass graves in Croatia. In Petrinja, they were placed near the New Hospital, Vila *Gavrilović*, Marinka, at the town cemetery of



St. Benedict and in the village of Taborište.

### Monument to Cardinal Franjo Kuharić

A bronze statue of Cardinal Franjo Kuharić, the work of academic sculptor Tomislav Kršnjavi, was erected in 2014 on Strossmayer's Promenade in the immediate vicinity of the Church of St. Lawrence. On St. Lawrence's Day in 1996, Archbishop Cardinal Franjo Kuharić placed the charter on the construction of the Church of St. Lawrence into the foundation stone from retrieved from the altar of the demolished church.



Hrastovačka gora is a north-western leg of Zrinska gora, from which it is separated by the valley of the Petrinjčica river. It covers most of the area of the town of Petrinja, and is adorned with deciduous forests, the most common of which are sessile oak, beech and sweet chestnut forests. Sweet chestnut forests are particularly prevalent in the Banovina region and make up one of the largest areas of chestnut forests in Europe. In some places on the hill, sedimentary rocks with fossil remains of the former Pannonian Sea stand out. The highest peak, Cepeliš, at 415 m above sea level, is a place of rest and entertainment in the vicinity of the Matija Filjak mountain lodge. Members of the Croatian Mountaineering Association Zrin Petrinja built a mountain lodge in 1939, which was destroyed in World War II. A new mountain lodge was built in 2007. Next to the lodge is a 17-meter-high lookout point with a beautiful view. There are numerous hiking and themed trails containing interpretation of natural and culturalhistorical heritage of Hrastovačka gora as well as the village Hrastovica. In the surrounding area, there are tourist estates offering accommodation and facilities for leisure and relaxation.

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The former Pecko Lake, which has dried up, today hides legends about the cursed man from Pecko Lake.



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## Thematic trails on Hrastovačka gora

#### Pyramid theme trail

The *Pyramid* theme trail starts from the *Matija Filjak* mountain lodge on the highest peak of Hrastovačka gora at 415 m above sea level. It leads to the area where there used to be a lake, a popular picnic spot with legends and two poems from the time of the Banska krajina. At that time, people said that a cursed creature was trapped in the lake, who would pull swimmers into the water and chain them in gold chains. One poem was written by Ivan pl. Trnski, and the other, with a slightly different content, by the poet Duro Arnold. There is no more a lake in this area, it has dried up, and today it is filled with various plant species, unusual for Hrastovačka gora. The path continues to a viewpoint from which you can enjoy a view of the Banovina hills, and the views are dominated by the village of Hrvatski Čuntić with the church of St. Anthony of Padua and the Franciscan monastery.

#### Stara Hrastovica theme trail

The *Stara Hrastovica* theme trail starts from the centre of the village of Hrastovica near the Bartolovac spring and the church of St. Bartol. There is a pleasant walk along a forest path to the narrow, steep-sided *Jendek* gorge, rich in water and shell rocks. The path passes by the remains of the *Church of the Holy Spirit* and *Stara Hrastovica*, the remains of former defensive towers from the time of the Ottoman invasion of these regions. The trail continues through a dense deciduous forest, of which beech, chestnut, hornbeam and oak stand out, and ends at the highest peak of Hrastovačka gora.

#### Pannonian Sea theme trail

The *Pannonian Sea* theme trail starts from the centre of the village of Hrastovica at the Bartolovac spring, and passes by the Church of St. Bartol, the local cemetery and the *Vrelo* ski resort. The path leads past a quarry and to the *Mesarićevo vrelo* spring. The path passes by the water supply pumping stations, and then reaches a panoramic point. Walking through a dense deciduous forest, you reach the highest peak of Hrastovačka gora at 415 m above sea level and the *Matija Filjak* mountain lodge.



## Inclusive Farm

The Inclusive Farm in Hrastovica is a separate organizational unit of the Association of Persons with Disabilities of Sisak-Moslavina County for programs of respite care for young and adult persons with disabilities. The entire infrastructure of the farm is adapted for the activities of workshops on growing and picking vegetables, berries and aromatic herbs, workshops on fruit and vegetable processing and housekeeping, and the combination of inclusion, tradition and tourism is certainly the tourist potential of the Inclusive Farm in Hrastovica. The current infrastructure of the farm is ideal for the so-called Robinson tourism, which is becoming increasingly popular, and now the Association offers quality facilities to tourists who derive their main pleasure from spending time in nature engaging in various activities, and who are willing to work and volunteer with persons with disabilities.

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## Cyclotourism routes

Cycling enthusiasts can explore the town and its surroundings through four local routes. The routes vary in difficulty and meet the needs of recreational and professional cyclists. They include paved roads, mostly local and with little traffic, but there is also one that leads along a macadam forest road along Hrastovačka gora and promises an adrenaline-pumping experience. The four Petrinja cycle routes are marked with the letters LR and the corresponding numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4. They are connected to the county routes that connect to the Sava Cycle Tourism Route between Zagreb and the Lonjsko Polje Nature Park. Guests are also provided with cyclotourism guides who will be happy to introduce them to this recreational and sports content.



#### LRI ZELENA DOLINA

Cycling along this route provides a unique experience of the green Banovina. The route, surrounded by pure nature and little traffic, will make this adventure ideal for a break from the everyday hustle and bustle.

#### LR2 KOTAR ŠUMA

The route that leads around Kotar Šuma is mostly on the main paved roads. However, you will be enchanted by the picturesque villages and the excellent gastronomic offer in the nearby rural households.

#### LR3 ALONG THE RIVER BANKS

Starting from the Town beach in Petrinja, this cycle route goes mainly along the banks of the Kupa River, which invite you to stop and refresh yourself in the greenblue waters of this peaceful river.

#### LR4 CHESTNUT ROUTE

Riding the adrenaline-pumping route from the town streets soon leads to the steeper macadam forest paths of Hrastovačka gora. Refreshment can be found on the highest peak, where the Matija Filjak mountain lodge is located, surrounded by a lookout point and deciduous forest.

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## Petrinja on stage



When the town is filled with the scent of Petrinja's linden trees at the beginning of June, all roads lead to the Town beach. During the summer months, numerous programs are held there, such as fish feast, motorcycle meetings, film festivals, sports events, folklore programs, music and dance evenings.

### FLIK - POTTERY AND CERAMICS FESTIVAL

Thanks to the centuries-old tradition of pottery and ceramics, a festival with various contents is held in Petrinja, with demonstrations of the production of souvenirs and utility items, as well as workshops for all generations and a wide range of participants, from amateurs to artistic creators.





#### LOVRENČEVO IN PETRINJA

At the beginning of August, Petrinja exudes a celebratory mood, and several-day programs mark the great victories and anniversaries. The central event is August 10th, the feast of St. Lawrence, the patron saint of the city, and the Day of the Town of Petrinja. It is the time of the liveliest gatherings in Petrinja and the hustle and bustle of life for the people of Petrinja.

#### PUF - PETRINJA STREET FESTIVAL

A festival with a variety of entertainment programs, street entertainers, workshops, competitions and music programs for all generations.

#### CHESTNUT FESTIVAL

An event that combines excursion tourism with recreational hiking and gastronomic pleasure in the surroundings of chestnut forests and with the intoxicating scent of roasted chestnuts.

#### **CAMINO BANOVINA**

Organized hiking along the path of St. James in the area of the towns of Sisak, Petrinja and Glina and the municipality of Topusko. The pilgrimage route is 75 kilometres long. The Camino Banovina is a part of the Santiago de Compostela Cultural Route of the Council of Europe dedicated to St. James. The event takes place in the spring over four days with events promoting Petrinja and Banovina.



#### **ADVENT IN PETRINJA**

Thanks to the unique Christmas customs cherished by the inhabitants of Petrinja, the town traditionally hosts programs such as the Christmas fair *Tominje in Petrinja*, a stage program of nativity scenes called *betlemaši*, Christmas Eve and Christmas concerts.



*Petrinjski betlemaši* is a traditional and unique custom of greetings held during Christmas time in the town of Petrinja. The custom consists of a procession in which a group of young people, the congratulators or betlemaši, visit families in their homes and perform reenactments of stories from the Bible. *Petrinjski betlemaši* have been recognized as an intangible cultural asset of the Republic of Croatia since 2015.



PUKAN'CA was entered into the Register of Cultural Heritage of the Republic of Croatia at the beginning of 2022 as an intangible cultural heritage. *Pukan'ca* is the local name for the white embroidery on the trousers of the men's folk costume of the Čuntić parish near Petrinja. The art of making pukan'ca embroidery is nurtured by members of the Čuntićanka cultural and artistic society, all with the aim of saving the art of making folk embroidery from oblivion and disappearance, and passing it on from generation to generation.

The cultural identity of Petrinja is recognizable through diverse artistic creativity, intangible cultural heritage, customs and nurturing of tradition. The centuries-old Petrinja Town Brass Band and the Croatian Singing Society Slavulj carry Petrinja's traditional songs and the joy of music far and wide. The folk creativity of the unique Pokuplje embroidery and the pure whiteness of the folk costumes with the tricolour of the Petrinja hinterland are a joy to the eves in the folklore programs of cultural and artistic societies, sections and associations. The art of weaving and handicrafts are the everyday work of the hardworking hands of Petrinja's craftsmen, and a special place belongs to pottery, which has survived in the city for three centuries.

Public Open University Croatian Home Petrinja is a leading cultural institution that hosts numerous programs related to culture, art, education and adult education. The

After the agony caused by the devastating earthquakes, thanks to the efforts of the employees, the First Croatian Container Library, the Petrinja City Library and Reading Room, was opened in Petrinja.

#### PETRINJA CITY LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

The Petrinja City Library and Reading Room was founded in 1842 during the Second Ban's Regiment as the *Kasino* Reading Room. Due to the consequences of the earthquake, the library and reading room is located on the temporary Culture Square, and in 2025 it will move to a newly renovated modern space. The institution has a department for adults, a department for children and youth, and a playroom called *Košnica* for preschool children. One of the institution's attractions is the *Petrinia* Local Collection with rich examples of old Petrinja historical publications, some of which are more than a hundred years old.

# Tradition and souvenirs

"

Stucka, as an original Petrinja souvenir, was already a symbol of Petrinja pottery in the 18th century.

Petrinja has a long tradition of souvenir production, and the most original are ceramic souvenirs made from Petrinja clay on a potter's wheel or hand-shaped. In addition to ceramics, souvenirs are made from various materials, either by traditional processing or modern tools, and their appearance and use are adapted to modern life.



#### **CERAMIC ATELIER PETRINJA**

The Ceramic atelier Petrinja is run by the GRAK Association - Civic Activism. It develops ceramic art and promotes the Petrinja pottery tradition. The atelier organizes courses and workshops through which participants are trained in the skills of making ceramic objects. It hosts an international artist residency, and through the work of the atelier, the GRAK Association has become one of the bearers of the protected intangible cultural asset *Pottery in the Petrinja area*.



Pottery in the Petrinja area has been an intangible cultural asset since 2024. Pottery in the Petrinja area is a set of knowledge and skills in digging and preparing local raw materials (earth-clay), working on a foot-powered potter's wheel, shaping, drying and baking products with specific characteristics, and includes spaces as well as social and cultural ties that arise from trading pottery products and the intertwining of pottery crafts and artistic work in Petrinja. A great contribution to pottery in Petrinja was made by master Matej Stanešić, the most famous Petrinja potter.

#### **SUNFLOWER**

A pottery workshop owned by Valentino Valent and his family, where you can experience the presentation and demonstration of souvenir production on a potter's wheel and learn about the centuries-old tradition of pottery in Petrinja. They offer the organization of pottery workshops for groups and ceramic souvenirs. *Sunflower* is one of the bearers of the protected intangible cultural asset *Pottery in the Petrinja area*.

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
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
